Officer and Committee Reports

Eboard report:

The Eboard opened a new Corporate banking account at the OneUnited bank. From their website, OneUnited Bank is "OneUnited Bank – the nation's largest Black-owned and FDIC insured bank – is leading the movement to BankBlack® and Buy Black, to garner our spending power and channel it back into our community to create jobs, build businesses and increase wealth. Yes...Black Lives Matter. Black Money Matters. We are the first Black internet bank and the largest Black owned bank in the country, with offices in Los Angeles, Boston and Miami. We were awarded the highest Bank Enterprise Award by the U.S. Department of Treasury for our community development lending ten times! We are a designated Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI)." OneUnited Bank does not issue credit cards. The Anti-Racism Committee will begin researching alternatives to the current corporate credit card account.

President's report:

Applied for a grant from NAE for a 10,000 grant to cover captioning from A21.Regardless an opportunity to get more experience with applying for this kind of grant. I will be continuing to look for other sources of funds. This covers accessibility in a virtual form. The next grant is the Shutter Venus operating grant and the deadline for that is June and given recent apparent changes in details about that we might be eligible so I will be looking into applying for it. president@arisia.org. In terms of targets, there is no maximum amount of money that we are looking for. We are hoping for an overall receipt of 23-30K in the upcoming year.

Treasurer's report:

Dues to join at this meeting are \$8. There was no out-of-budget spending in April.

COMMITTEE REPORT:

Anti-Racism Committee:

The committee met on May 8 to discuss previous goals, milestones met and goals for the future. Several people attended a training put on by Vox that incorporated mindfulness into anti-racist, anti-caste, and anti-class work. The committee is excited by the opening of the new corporate account at OneUnited Bank. Future goals include pairing down the list of books at Goodreads on the starter shelf to 10 or less, to create the scholarship for BIPOC attendees to Arisia events, and research into vendors that are either BIPOC-owned and operated and/or embrace socially just/anti-racist practices.

Arisia 2022:

We will be posting the date for the next ConComm meeting once confirmed with the Conchair team. We consulted with Eboard, but want to also bring to the membership, the corporate membership requirement for senior staff. Typically Div Heads are Corp members and Area heads don't need to be. Since we are restructuring this year, our approach will be that someone on each team should be a Corp member. Further commentary and questions on this are welcome, feel free to contact the conchair team.

Incident Review and Management Committee report

General Content Warnings Ahead: s*xual assault, r*pe, st*lking, h*r*ssment

Arisia received a report on November 16, 2018 with concerns that an attendee who had previously hosted parties outside of Arisia had mishandled a disclosure during a party. The EBoard and IRMC previously decided to provisionally restrict the attendee from hosting events and/or parties during Arisia 2019. After looking into the report further, the IRMC has recommended, and the Eboard has accepted, to uphold the provisional restriction, but not to put any further restrictions in place.

CW: sexual assault, rape

Arisia received a report in November 2018 that a former attendee had engaged in sexual assault and rape of a person in a non-Arisia space. After looking into the report, the IRMC recommended, and Eboard had accepted, to issue a provisional ban of attendance for both Arisia 2019 and 2020. After further investigation, the IRMC and Eboard decided that due to the serious nature of the reported actions, the individual will be banned from attending all Arisia events, permanently.

CW: sexual assault, stalking

Arisia received a report that a staff member had engaged in sexual assault and stalking behavior at Balticon and NADWcon in May of 2014. After looking into the report, the IRMC recommended, and the Eboard has accepted the decision to permanently ban the individual from all Arisia events.

CW: sexual assault, harrassment/blackmail

At the 2020 Arisia, the IRT received an anonymous report concerning an incident that had taken place in 2015 in a non-Arisia space. The report stated that a former member of staff sexually assaulted and attempted to blackmail an individual. The reporter stated that they did not wish us to take action. IRMC policy is that when someone reports and does not wish us to take action, we do not do so "except under extreme circumstances where there may exist immediate danger to others." With the information we have been able to discover, we do not think that this situation meets that threshold. For this reason, the IRMC recommended, and the Eboard accepted the decision to close this IR without action.

IRMC has been doing interviews and appreciates folks interested in working with IRMC.
