Motion for a Bylaws Change re: Election Nomination Deadline:
Rachel T. made a motion to change the Bylaws as follows:
Replace 3.4(c) Additional nominations may be made from the floor during elections. Nomination from the floor of a person not present at the meeting is not valid unless written consent of the

nominee is submitted to the presiding officer.

Nominations for elections will close four days before the meeting at which said election is to take place. A nominee for one position may choose to run for a different position after said deadline, but the overall list of nominees for that election may not change after the deadline.

 Rachel T. noted that she was making this motion because when people self-nominate at the last minute, the IRMC has very little time to look up whether or not there is a current Incident Report (IR) regarding the candidate, and sometimes the candidate has not yet been notified of that IR. It is possible that a candidate - and the rest of the Corporation could find out about said IR for the first time at the time of the election. Rachel would like to avoid this situation if possible.

- Claudia asked if this situation had come up at the September Corporate meeting. It did not, but it has before. Claudia prefers the ability to self-nonimate in the moment.
- Charles H. pointed out that a similar situation did occur recently. He felt that the IRMC
  process was opaque and wanted to know what details would be revealed should there
  be an active IR regarding a candidate. Rachel replied that no details would be revealed,
  only that a current IR was in process.
- Rick stated that he wants the IRMC to notify people within a week of any IRs involving them. Rachel T. stated that she would oppose this.
- Rachel S. suggested that election notifications include a request for people to let the Clerk know if they're even considering running, in lieu of a Bylaws change. Several members agreed. Ilene suggested that the Clerk let people know in the election notification that the IRMC will check for IRs involving any candidates.
- Phi said that being able to vote for None of the Above and request secret ballots makes it less necessary for people to jump in and run against unfortunate candidates at the last minute.
- Sharon agrees with Rachel S. that we should give people the flexibility to run for office at the last minute.
- Rachel T. stated that she was more intent on avoiding awkward situations regarding candidates and IRs than on changing the Bylaws. Since the solution she'd thought of was specifically contraindicated in the Bylaws, she had created a motion to change them. She is open to other solutions.
- The motion was seconded and then tabled until the next meeting.

The proposed budget can be approved as an interim budget and we can go over it again the next meeting, or we can approve it as written and Joel can cut parts from last year we won't be using this year.

- This proposed budget is based on Wendee's budget from last year.
- Actuals were lower, but so was income.
- Registration totals have been lowered by 10%.
- This budget is in the red by \$10,000. Phi hopes to make up half the shortfall from cuts and half from a reduction in the contribution from the Corporation.
- Arisia policy dictates that the Con Chair Discretionary fund, which covers personal
  expenses of the Con Chair incurred in service of the convention, be 2% of the total
  budget. That amount was higher last year because there were four Con Chairs. This
  year, it's back to 2%.
- Credit card fees are calculated based on how much money the convention receives via credit card.
- Hotel rooms and Guest of Honor Liaison budgets are based on items in the hotel contract.
- Suites are more expensive this year, as are hotel room comps.

#### Discussion:

- Charles H. asked about the reduction in Programming room costs compared to 2025.
   Tanya noted that the sleeping rooms we used for programming spaces didn't work out well. They made more problems than they solved.
- Hotel furniture removal was removed from the 2026 budget; the hotel didn't charge us for it last year. We have no plans for furniture removal in 2026.
- Lighting costs were cut because we will restrict our lighting needs to equipment that we own or can borrow easily. The issue is more staffing than money.
- We didn't spend money on sound last year either. Audio costs include rental of
  equipment and labor for setup, which was done by an outside company. We hope for
  better sound this year, which is why our costs are not zero this year.
- We didn't spend all of our Space Pilot money last year, but we don't have actuals yet for what we did spend. Allison will get more information to phi. Comp rooms count as income or negative expenses, so those numbers are important to factor in. Phi and

- Allison will figure out actuals. Charles H. wondered if Space Pilot is worth the expenditure.
- Charles H. had questions about the costs for the Access Division, particularly American Sign Language (ASL) costs.
  - He asked about ASL vs. CART (live captioning), since Anime Boston provides captioning for less money than we're spending on ASL interpretation.
  - Rachel T. explained that ASL and CART are for different populations of people, and Tanya noted that our current hotel doesn't have the technology required to provide quality CART.
  - Charles wanted to know if we could get volunteers to do ASL interpretation, but Rachel responded that ASL interpretation does not happen on a volunteer basis.
  - Charles pointed out that access costs make up 16% of the convention budget and wanted to know if they were worth it.
  - Phi clarified that the Access Transport shuttle cost is there because the hotel shuttle is inaccessible and inadequate to our needs. He also stated that CART is great for neurodiverse people as well.
  - Mike S. mentioned that Anime Boston is a completely different con with a different budget, and that we do not have the volunteers to provide ASL interpretation. Some things require professionals in order to provide sufficient quality. He also noted that providing access poorly or not at all sends a message to people with disabilities that they are unwelcome.
  - Rachel T. talked about how exhausting it is to have one's access needs and civil rights continually debated, and how demoralizing it is to listen to people discussing whether or not access is worth having.
  - Joel said if anyone wants to cut the funds for ASL, they should make a motion, and that saying "I think someone should [volunteer for] this" only works when we have enough people to do the thing.
- Tanya asked about ASCAP and BMI costs since we don't show movies anymore. Those
  costs cover music that we play. We no longer have video licensing.
- Henry asked about a line item for registration printers. Renting printers is in the convention budget; buying them would be in the Corporate budget.
- Joel made a motion to approve the budget. He reminded the membership that the budget can be modified.
- Cate asked about adding \$60 to the budget for an app called Buffer, which will help with social media efforts, Joel said that money could also come out of discretionary funds. Phi suggested that it be added under Communications. Cate noted that it also benefits the Corporation. Three months of Buffer costs \$60; a year costs \$240. \$60 will cover us until after the convention. After that, we can come back and see if the rest of the year's subscription can come out of the Corporate budget. Rob asked if people can donate money for specific line items. Phi asked for notice about it but doesn't want to discourage doing so.

Motion to approve this budget with the amendment to add \$60 for Buffer is seconded. **MOTION PASSES.** 

Joel noted that this budget will be revisited and cuts will be made.

The Corporation voted via voice vote to set the February corporate meeting date for **Tuesday**, **February 17**, **2026 at 7:00 pm over Zoom**.
