Old Business:

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Motion for a Bylaws Change re: Election Nomination Deadline:

Rachel T. made a motion at the October meeting to change the Bylaws as follows:

Replace 3.4(c) Additional nominations may be made from the floor during elections. Nomination from the floor of a person not present at the meeting is not valid unless written consent of the nominee is submitted to the presiding officer.

with

Nominations for elections will close four days before the meeting at which said election is to take place. A nominee for one position may choose to run for a different position after said deadline, but the overall list of nominees for that election may not change after the deadline.

llene noted that we have uncontested races and we don't want to prevent people from running. She likes the idea of encouraging people to announce their candidacy to the Corp mailing list ahead of time but not requiring it, and suggesting that candidates reach out to the IRMC. It might be the right time for such a bylaws change at some point, but it's not the right time now.

phi said that last meeting there was a suggestion that the IRMC be required to notify people that they are the subject of an IR within some set amount of time. Most IRs come in right before a Corp meeting - there's a Corp meeting at the convention, where most IRs originate. It's not reasonable to expect the IRMC to notify people before that meeting takes place. Even if such a requirement were achievable, it's not effective. It's also not a reasonable goal as long as the IRMC is overworked and handling HR issues along with Code of Conduct violations. Rick said that having an election at the in-person meeting is a bad idea and so is this proposal, because if a candidate does have an IR regarding them, people can't decide to run against them when they find out about it. Ilene agreed about elections at con being a bad idea.

A two-thirds majority with 25% of all general members voting would be required in order for this Bylaws change to pass.

MOTION FAILS. 6-14

New Business:

Tanya made the following statement:

"This year's convention is happening. But it is taking some miracles, and those are in shorter and shorter supply.

We have no Con Chair for next year (2027).

We have no venue for next year.

We have a model that depends on economic systems that no longer exist in the hospitality industry.

Maybe it is time to take a break, and do some work, before we break the rest of the way.

As head of the Long Range Planning Committee, I've spent the last couple of months listening to a lot of people, and asking some leading questions, and, as we reported in September, we have a lot of work to do that will take expertise, and many hands to get done.

We could decide to do something different this year.

Instead of working on a 2027 convention, we can work on our infrastructure, from inventories and software, to documentation and new processes, with Division Heads, timelines and tasks. We could spend a year with some small events during the year... building our future, while maintaining our community.

This is not the meeting to outline all the things we need to do, but a chance to decide, if we want to devote a year to building ourselves back up, making some decisions about our priorities, so we meet whatever new challenges this timeline throws at us with some resiliency and strength."

Ilene suggested a Plan-A-Con, and agreed that we can't repeat what we're doing this year.

Rachel agreed with Tanya and felt that the vote should happen in December so people can be aware of it and show up to vote.

Rick concurred with the need to take a break, but noted that hotels are desperate right now, so we could get a pretty good deal on a contract. He stated that we also need to be honest with ourselves about why we aren't attracting more people.

Elliott asked what we were going to do with the hiatus.

Mike S. seconded the motion to take a year off.

Joseph said that he would only be in favor of taking a year off to rebuild community if we had a solid plan for how to do so.

Jason asked if the motion was to consider taking a break or actually to take a break. Tanya said the motion is to decide whether or not we are having a convention in 2027, but that she had not laid out what we should do with the break. We are holding a convention with the expertise we have, and we should do that with the break too and see who comes forward to help out. We don't want to vote on doing things we don't have the people to do.

phi moved to amend the motion to "move to direct the December meeting to decide". Tanya took that suggestion as friendly.

Henry asked if there were a lot of new members who had not yet attended a meeting and could not vote in December. Rachel said there were a small number but that she would not be able to give an exact number while also taking minutes for the meeting. Joseph asked if we could have a short preliminary meeting to make those people eligible to vote at the December meeting. Mike S. noted that that had been very controversial the one time it happened, and the Bylaws are not clear on whether that workaround is allowable. He also pointed out that the people who run the convention make up about 10% of the people who attend, which is normal for cons. The Corporate body is smaller than that 10%. The Corporation makes the decisions. People know the rules of voting when they sign up and can plan to attend meetings accordingly in order to become eligible to vote. In any case, it's not a large number of people. Joseph noted that even if a person can't vote, they can attend and express their opinion.

llene asked for clarification on the motion. The motion is to direct the December meeting to decide whether we should hold a convention in 2027 or to take a break and work on ourselves. llene made a friendly amendment to clear up the language to make it less conditional and ambiguous. Two options: continue with the convention to our best effort, or focus the convention year on addressing systemic issues so that we may come back in 2028.

Rachel wrote up the motion:

Motion to direct the Corporation to vote in the December meeting on whether to make our best effort to hold the 2027 convention or to instead focus the convention year on addressing Arisia's systemic issues so that the convention may return in 2028.

Elliott moved to call the question.

The Corporation voted to set the March corporate meeting date for **Sunday, March 15, 2026 at 2:00 pm over Zoom.**
